



## REBATE PROGRAM REWARDS again and again and again ...

The City of Grand Rapids has received its third conservation improvement rebate from Minnesota Energy Resources. Their latest improvement project focused on three city-owned buildings: City Hall, the Civic Center and the Library. Each building is now equipped with a state-of-the-art computerized heating and cooling system, which has resulted in some very happy city employees and an \$8,091 rebate check.

Employees were thrilled when the new integrated heating and cooling systems were installed. Now, each employee has the ability to control his or her own room temperature. If rooms are not being occupied, the system automatically puts the vacant room in an energy-saving mode. Should the rooms exceed the business standard heating or cooling setting, the building's energy manager has the ability to override the temperature.
